Position Title: Pre-College Youth Programs Specialist

Hours of Service: 9am-5pm M-F (At least 1,700 hours over the 10.5 month term of service)

Summary of Position: The Pre-College Youth Programs Specialist AmeriCorps member will serve Pacific University and the surrounding communities of Washington County, Oregon by developing and implementing academic summer programs for local youth. The C2C Pre-College Youth Programs AmeriCorps member will work with schools, families, youth, community partners and Pacific students, faculty, and staff to assess community assets and needs related to pre-college school year and summer opportunities for student support using a racial equity lens. They will help design and implement a pilot program for pre-college academic enrichment activities at Pacific University accessible to youth from historically marginalized backgrounds. The goal of the project is to develop and improve opportunities for K-12 local youth to learn and engage with Pacific, so that students from backgrounds that have been historically marginalized and potential first generation college students can reach their educational goals.

Responsibilities and Related Tasks:

- Research best practices in K-12 student success and pre-college youth programs.
- Assess the needs and interests of K-12 local youth and use the information to inform the development of program goals and objectives.
- Communicate with K-12 schools, partners, families, and Pacific students via email and phone.
- Identify opportunities for assessment and establish data tracking procedures.
- Support instructional activities related to student success and engagement strategies
- Collaborate with Pacific University faculty and staff, as well as community partners to explore and design pre-college youth programming.
- Develop communication materials and an outreach strategy to reach potential students.
- Establish program mission, values, and procedures to support effective youth engagement
- Assist with implementation of a pilot academic outreach program for local youth.
- Envision pre-college youth programming goals over the next few years, to expand Pacific's engagement with the local community beyond a pilot outreach program

- Experience conducting and utilizing research (e.g. interviews, focus groups, surveys)
- Demonstrated commitment to working with diverse students and community partners
- Bilingual English/Spanish
